Academic Approaches to Student Success

- How can we become more transfer-friendly and attractive to new students?
 - Finding new ways within our distinctively Alverno approach to meet student where they are and helping them achieve their goals without adding expense and time-to-degree.
- How can we improve climate and engagement to build on retention successes and help students persist and thrive?
 - This includes expanding academic opportunities to engage in HIPs and developing more culturally responsive and universally accessible curriculum and pedagogy.
- How can we better serve our students as an MSI that has HIS designation?
 - This includes examining systems, policies, and practices to intentionally remove barriers and help elevate the strengths of a diverse student body.

Academic Approaches to Student Success

- How can we use technology to expand access to opportunity for more students?
 - Exploring and adapting, where appropriate, HyFlex and other approaches to help students engage and succeed regardless of life circumstances, as well as rethinking systems and approaches to support students "from Milwaukee to Mesa."
- How can we engage in "next horizon" thinking about approaches to narratives and GPEs that strengthens our ability to meet new and emerging demands of students responsibly, equitably and efficiently?
 - This includes narrative transcript processes for alumnae (pre/post-2017), as well as accessing GPEs and intentionally considering the potential impact this has on our campus and approach to education.
